From Woody: There was an interesting and informative column in the Union Leader the other day. It was written by Jodi Picoult, a New York Times bestselling author who lives in New Hampshire. She discusses a recent development that has historical roots in the 20th century in Nazi Germany. It is the banning of books. There is going to be a bill voted on this Thursday in the State Senate, SB 523, which allows a school principal or another individual to ban a book without a review committee. This trend, which began recently in

Florida, would seem to be a dangerous one. She does not object to parents reading a book and deciding it is not right for their child. She does object to a parent deciding unilaterally that no child should be allowed to read that book.

One of her books that has been banned frequently is NINETEEN MINUTES, which is about a school shooting and the effects of bullying. It contains a a single page describing a date rape in non gratuitous nor graphic terms. She says that since writing the book she has received thousands of emails from bullied kids who said the book was the reason they decided not to bring a gun to school and not to commit suicide.

Pointing out that book bans have increased over 1100% since 2020 and have occurred in 41 states and have affected millions of students, she has this thought to consider, "What does it say about our world when 'keeping children safe' means banning a book about school shootings...but not regulating the guns that cause those real-life shootings?"

That is some serious food for thought. By the way, if books are going to be banned for sex or violence, the Bible would be among the books to go. Her whole column is certainly worth reading. I will make some copies to have available at the church on the table in the hall.
